## A Tragic Loss in Africa's Higher Education Sector

Kampala June 28<sup>th</sup> 2022 – The RUFORUM Network on a sad note has lost one of her greatest female Vice Chancellors, Prof Christine Dranzoa, Vice Chancellor for Muni University and a fervent advocate of the girl child education. The late professor, rose from a humble background in a small village of Adua, in Moyo district and has been spearheading the University since its inception in 2014. At the time of her death, Prof Dranzoa, 59, was also serving as the Executive Committee chairperson of Inter University Council of East Africa (IUCEA).

Prof. Dranzoa began lecturing at the Faculty of Veterinary Science at Makerere University in 1991 and she was entrusted to head the Wildlife and Animal Resource Management unit and oversee its development. By the time she left the portfolio in 2005 to take on administrative roles, the faculty had transformed into the College of Veterinary Medicine, Animal Resources and Bio-Security. She became the Deputy Director of the Makerere University School of Graduate Studies

until 2010 when the government appointed her the Chairperson of the Muni University Taskforce and the de facto Vice Chancellor.

Late Prof. Dranzoa's work driven by persistence, dedication and consistency, attracted wide ranging recognition from the public including her professional peers. Her first major recognition was in 1999 from the Forum for African Women Educationists-Uganda Chapter awarded Dranzoa a medal of excellence in education for mentoring the girl child and she became the Honorary Secretary for the pan-African body. In 2002 her contribution in wildlife conservation was rewarded by the Dierenpark Amersfoort of the Netherlands with the Wankele Aarde (Unbalanced Earth Trophy). The Pan-African Ornithological Congress between 2004 and 2008 made her its President in honor of Dranzoa's contribution in the field of avian research and conservation.

She was a founding member of the Forum for Women Vice Chancellors in Africa (FAWoVC), which was established in 2016 to encourage more women to take leadership role and provide a platform to significantly influence the development of higher education in the continent. Prof. Dranzoa was a member of the RUFORUM Board and a member of the RUFORUM Finance and Administration Committee and she actively facilitated a number of RUFORUM webinars and Annual General Meetings.
